**Textbook:** *Bible Truths F – Patterns for Christian Living* (BJU Press)

## Course Description

This course covers a biblical understanding to issues faced by contemporary teens. Moral decision-making, dating, choosing a college, developing relationships, studying the Bible, gender roles, politics, technology, depression, evangelism—the book is relative to where students are right now.

## Course Objectives

By the end of the course, the students should be able to:

1. Apply a biblical worldview to the major decisions and issues facing Christian teens today.
2. Understand the Bible's relevance to all areas of the Christian walk.
3. Use biblical discernment in the grey areas of the Christian life.

## General Policies

1. Students must be in the classroom when the bell rings.
2. Students should not work on anything not pertaining to the topic at hand (**e.g.: work for other classes or work on homework when students should be taking notes**) If students are caught working on something else, their work will be taken and disposed of.
3. Students should not bother other students around them. If necessary, students will be given verbal warnings and/or demerits.

## Late Policy

If a student does not turn homework on time, he or she will be given a 25% penalty after the first day. For example, if the student does not turn in homework on

Wednesday, he or she can turn it in Thursday for a maximum of 75%. When the homework is turned in two days late, a 50% penalty will be assessed. After the second day, the student will have a maximum of one week to turn in the assignment for a 50% maximum score. If the student does not turn in the homework after a full week, he or she will be given a zero on that assignment. Parents will be notified of late assignments or failure to complete assignment at the discretion of the teacher.

### **Absences**

If students miss any days due to an excused absence, the student has the same number of days to make it up. **The student is responsible to find out the work missed and then to make it up (including notes).** If the student misses the day with an unexcused absence, he will be given an automatic zero in the assignment (**this includes both homework and quizzes**).

If you are absent the day before the test, but you knew the test was scheduled (and no new material was given), you will be given the test with the rest of class – no extra makeup days will be given. If you are absent the day of the test, you will need to make up the test the day you return (in a study hall or after school time to avoid missing even more class time).

### **Cheating**

Students are expected to do their own work on all assignments, quizzes and tests. Students should not share any homework answers with another student. If a fellow classmate asks for answers, you are expected to refuse his request. By giving away your answers, you will be responsible for cheating as well. If you wish to help another struggling student, you could point them to the page on which you found the answer. Giving answers to other students, however, ignores the entire purpose of homework. Students who are caught cheating will be given zeros on the assignment and be dealt with according to the student handbooks.

### **Chromebook Usage**

Chromebooks are for educational purposes in classes only. The school has equipped each student computer with GoGuardian classroom to encourage accountability for each student to keep on task. If a student is found working on non-class related items, he will be given consequences according with the severity and regularity of the occurrence.
